

The Wartime Camps at Hay

The Hay Historical Society's latest publication tells the story of the three prisoner of war and internment camps set up at Hay in the Western Riverina during World War II. A large collection of original documents, memoirs and newspaper reports have been gathered together in this book, and are illustrated with an amazing selection of photographs and artworks. The building of the camps, the arrival of internees and POWs, the garrison battalion, the military hospital, the farming enterprises, the murders in the Italian camp, the deaths of Japanese civilians and much more is included. The story of the first internees, the German and Austrian Jews who were sent out on the Dunera is re-told, with much new material including a diary of the voyage.

Haywire is A4 in size, 200 pages long and is printed on quality art paper. A special feature is a full colour section of reproductions of artworks and of historic camps postal memorabilia. A time-line is provided, the book is fully indexed, a glossary of military terms is included, and a selection of maps and plans helps the reader to follow the written account. A list of nearly 1000 Garrison members is included, with some fascinating information on their daily menus and provisions.
